Bimla Poddar and Trustee Shri Rahul Jain received the prestigious 'Padmashree' award from the Government of India. 
Jñāna-Pravāha is running a city unit Samskara & Anushthana Kendra at Meerghat, Varanasi, which aims at nourishing the glorious traditions of infusing samskaras and discipline among the younger generation aspiring to become purohitas. This is executed in Gurukula tradition. The emphasis is laid on correct pronunciation and proper recitation of the Vedic hymns, performing of rites and rituals along with ceremonies, knowledge of Jyotisha (Astrology) and good grasp of Sanskrit grammar. The duration of the course is three years. Prof. Sita Ram Shastri and Prof. Yugal Kishor Mishra share the major responsibility in the functioning of the Centre. Every year 10 new students are admitted after interview by panel of experts. All the passed out students are now into active service of the society and earning well for their livelihood.






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## Kalamandapa (Museum)

The Jñāna-Pravāha Museum (*Kalamandapa*) houses Late Shri Suresh Neotia's personal collection of rare paintings, sculptures, terracotta, coins and decorative art items. It is further enriched with display of textiles like Banaras brocades, Kashmiri shawls, Baluchara *saris*, Kantha from Bengal, Pulkari from Punjab, etc. and appended with a number of objects like silver representing Kashmir and Banaras handicrafts, musical instruments from Bengal and other regions of the


country. Some outstanding exhibits include a huge Kalamkari, a dated copperplate of King Harshavardhana and an exceptional piece of textile 'Samit' from eastern India. C. 8<sup>th</sup> century BCE objects of Ramnagar, Varanasi are added attraction. New acquisitions include a Varanasi Copperplate of Govindachandra of Gahadavala dynasty, Gara (sari) and Decorative Torana with Parsi embroidery. The Banaras Gallery (a separate wing) exhibits various aspects of Kashi Culture and Art.

## **Reference Library**

The Reference Library consists of around 20,000 books & several rare manuscripts on various aspects of Indology, e.g. Art, Culture, Philosophy, Religion, Sanskrit, History, Epigraphy, Numismatics, Archaeology and allied subjects. Besides the main library, one section contains books on Sanskrit and Classical Literature, while the other on every aspect of Varanasi.



## **Social Service**

A Charitable Homeopathic Dispensary, managed by Dr. Purnendu Chakraborty, is serving the people. It is quite popular among the residents of nearby and far off urban and rural areas. About 20,000 patients on an average avail the benefit of this service every year.



## Shilpashala (The Handicraft Atelier)

Art & Craft Development and Promotion Wing aims to preserve and promote the fast diminishing traditional art and craft of Varanasi. Required facilities are provided to the artisans for salvaging these dying traditions. The Atelier is progressing well under the supervision of Dr. Pramod Giri. It produces various objects in ashtadhatu (alloy of 8 metals) and repousse in copper & brass.
